The Cause We Plead

Shortly before his betrayal Jesus prayed for His disciples. The essence of that prayer was that they would be united (John 17:20, 21). He knew that unity would lead to faith, and that division would result in unbelief. Today Christendom is divided, and as a result the world is lost in unbelief.

We read of only one church in the New Testament (Colossians 1:18; Ephesians 4:4). There should be only one church today. It is an insult to our Lord and injurious to His cause that there are so many different churches today. Imagine how confusing it must be to one who is searching for truth to encounter so many different and contradictory beliefs and practices, and yet to be told that all of these various religious groups together constitute the church that
