WHAT DID SHE SAY?

A home economist, in a demonstration before a group of farm wives, gave her audience the following instructions. She said: "Take an egg and carefully perforate it at the basal end. Duplicate the process in the apex. Now apply the lips to one of the apertures and, by forcibly exhaling the breath, discharge the contents." On hearing this, an elderly woman whispered to a friend, "It just beats all how different these newfangled ways are. When I was a gal, we just poked a hole in both ends and blowed!"

The simplest procedure can be complicated if we choose to do so. Preachers are especially gifted at the art. Have you ever listened to one speak, only to ask when he finished, "What did he say?" The whole purpose of communication is defeated if the message is shrouded in obscure and meaningless phrases. The apostle Paul's preaching was effective because he did not *use "enticing words of man's wisdom"* (1 Corinthians 2:1, 4).

Sure, it may sound like he knows what he is talking about. But do you know what he said? The Bible warns us of those who "by good words and fair speeches deceive the hearts of the simple" (Romans 16:18).

PANTRY

The pantry item of the week is instant pudding/jello.

GOD MADE LIFE INTERESTING

Seeds may be dropped into the ground upside down or sideways, yet the plants come up to the surface. One grain of corn will produce a stalk on which there may be two ears, with perhaps 742 grains on each ear. A light crop of wheat will produce approximately thirty grains on each stalk; a good crop will produce approximately sixty grains per stalk. There will always be an even number of grains.

Beans grow up a pole from left to right, while the morning glory grows up a pole from right to left. If turned upside down, "twining" plants will uncoil and recircle their support. Guide a twiner in the "wrong" direction, and the plant will rewind itself. The higher a twiner grows, the more tightly it clasps it support.

The dandelion will grow above its surroundings whether the grass be two, ten, or twenty inches, for it must get up into the sunlight. An ordinary watermelon will have ten stripes on it. Larger ones may have twelve to sixteen stripes but always an even number. Every form of life in the vegetable and animal kingdom has a predetermined set of characteristics, a master plan perfect in every detail—God's plan. God has a perfect plan for my life and yours which supplies all our needs—His Word (II Peter 1:3). By His grace we receive strength to rise above all our circumstances (Romans 8:31).

How wonderful to witness His majesty in the changing seasons.
