Dr. Grayson wrote: "Scientist never have final answers. What we have are observations, from which we weave stories that make sense of the evidence. In telling these stories, we have to keep them logically coherent and consistent with all the empirical observations. The result of all of this repeated storytelling is that science is always marching toward an end it can never reach—a complete description of reality. As neuroscientist Thomas Schofield put it, 'Science is not about finding the truth at all, but about finding better ways to be wrong. . . . A theory can never be perfect: the best it can be is better than the theory that went before it'" (After, by Bruce Greyson, M. D., page 92).

As a Christian I am not anti-science, but I understand the limitations of science. I put my faith in God and not in science. A true scientist seeks honest answers to real questions. They follow the evidence where it leads. They do not direct the evidence to where they want to go for that would be pseudoscience (false science). Pseudoscience often occurs with the politicization of real science. Real science is not anti-Christian, and science with a political agenda is not science at all. So frankly, as a Christian I put my faith in God who cannot lie (Hebrews 6:18). He is not motivated by politics or money, and in His word I find true science (knowledge).
