Jesus proclaimed, "Truly I say to you, unless you change and become like children, you will not enter the kingdom of God" (Matthew 18:3). Sadly, many grow from soft-hearted children into hard-hearted adults. Soft hearts hold open minds, open hands, and warm embrace for others. Hard hearts close the mind, clinch the fists, and think of self before others.

Perhaps, the only person they bow before is their own person, giving themselves the worship that is due God.
