

Finish the Race...Fight the Fight

The 2024 Olympics are in the books. Did you watch them? There were those who did not watch them for various reasons, but there were many who did. Whether you were one who watched, or one who didn't, the games always seem to be filled with memorable moments.

The Summer Olympics usually amass more athletes than their winter counterpart. There were about 2,900 competitors at the last winter games compared to 10,500 at this year's summer offering! Yet out of all those elite athletes less than 2,150 medals were awarded; more than three quarters of those competing went away empty handed!

Either the apostle Paul was a sports fan, or maybe he simply appreciated the rich spiritual parallels that can be gleaned from athletic events. In First Corinthians 9.24-27 he uses an analogy, "Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one receives the prize? So run that you may obtain it. Every ath-

lete exercises self-control in all things. They do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable. So I do not run aimlessly; I do not box as one beating the air. But I discipline my body and keep it under control lest after preaching to others I myself should be disqualified."

In 2 Timothy, when faced with the executioner's sword, Paul said, "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race. I have kept the faith. Henceforth there is laid up for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous judge will award to me on that day, and not only to me, but also to all who have loved his appearing," (4.7-8).

Consider that only a handful of people walk away from the Olympics with any medals. They all put in the work. Hours of sacrifice, blood, sweat and tears, only to go home with nothing but souvenirs and photos to show. I wonder how a person would feel. Many would likely be thankful for the opportunity that they had just been given. Still others will see that just being able to compete on such a stage is a rare opportunity. But undoubtedly there are those who may have only been a fraction of a second from winning the prize. That would be difficult to grasp.

But, in this spiritual race, we do not compete against each other. Rather, we follow Jesus, and by taking his lead, we will not go away empty handed. No, we will not receive anything like a participation trophy, but instead we will receive the victor's crown. The athletes of Paul's day would contend for a crown made of olive leaves, which would dry within days. Our crown is imperishable. It will not fade in a few days, but rather it will shine just as brightly as the moment we first received it. Are you running the race? Are you fighting the fight? In Christ, you will have an eternal crown of victory.
