



because even in the dark of evening, my eyes were being overloaded with sights previously unseen. What a blessing it was to receive "sharper" vision!

There are several times in the gospel accounts wherein we read of Jesus restoring vision to one who was blind. One of the most well-known of these miracles is in the ninth chapter of John. Being near-sighted is one thing, but to be completely blind would be utterly tragic. Can you imagine, not being able to see anything at all? How much different would your life be? What things do you enjoy now that you would not be able to? Think about it for a second. Could you imagine what it would be like to never witness a sunrise or a sunset? What if you learned about God's promise of the rainbow, but never saw its colorful array? How awful! If you have a spouse, can you imagine never being able to see their loving face or the trusting eyes of your children and grandchildren. But consider that the blind man in John 9 had never seen anything before, until Jesus. The first thing that he saw was Jesus! The Lord gave this man His vision and turned tragedy into triumph!

Another tragic thing can occur. God's people often lack vision. Proverbs 29.18 says, "where there is no vision, the people perish." How can we apply this? God's people need to be looking up. We must not be near-sighted (focusing on ourselves only), but we must ever be looking up, and focusing on Jesus (Hebrews 12.2), that we may see clearly as we live our lives, looking for ways that we are able to glorify our Father from whom all good things come.
