

A few weeks ago, there was a news report that stated that a message in a bottle was discovered at an archaeological dig in France. You can imagine the excitement that must have been experienced by all who were apart of that discovery – especially to discover that it was over two hundred years old, and it was left there by another archaeologist in order to be uncovered sometime in the future!

The message read simply, "PJ Ferret, a native of Dieppe, member of various intellectual societies, carried out excavations here in January 1825. He continues his investigations in this vast area known as the Cite de Limes or Caesar's Camp." The message is not profound or even notable to most of us — though it is for those in that field for various reasons.

Archaeology can be much more exciting than finding messages in a bottle. Did you know that this field of study has proved the veracity of the scriptures time and again? There have been many times that biblical skeptics have had to

walk back on statements that they have made concerning the historical truthfulness of God's Word.

The accuracy of our Old Testaments was confirmed in 1947 when archaeologists found "The Dead Sea Scrolls" on the West Bank in Israel. These scrolls contained Old Testaments scriptures dating to one thousand years older compared to what was in hand previously. The thing that shocked skeptics was that those manuscripts agreed with the "younger" ones 99.5% of the time – meaning that the scribes who had copied them did their job incredibly well. The .5% differences are simple spelling differences and sentence structure that does not change the meaning of the sentence.

But what about the New Testament? In fact, while there are those who like to spout that the Bible has been corrupted and changed over the years — no serious historian believes that to be true. The New Testament is humanity's most reliable ancient document. All manuscripts in ancient time were recorded on papyrus which did not have a very long shelf life, so people would hand copy the originals to maintain the message and circulate it to others.

Here are a couple of comparisons to help us understand how accurate our New Testaments are. Plato wrote The Republic in 380 BC. Few people doubt that this is true. However, the very earliest copy we have of Plato's Republic is from 980 AD. That is a 1,300 year difference between the original the earliest text in possession! There are only seven copies in existence.

Gallic Wars was written by Caesar somewhere between 100-44BC. The earliest manuscripts that is in possession is around 900AD. Currently, and for a long time, there are only ten in existence.

Consider the New Testament manuscripts. The twenty-seven books and letters that we have in our scriptures were written between 50-100 AD (some would say it was completed a few decades prior to this). There are more than 5,000 known copies, and all of them are within 50-225 years of the original writing. The scribes

(usually monks) who copied the New Testament manuscripts were very meticulous in their work. They would check and recheck to make sure that it perfectly matched, and of course other scribes would check each other's work. What we have in the Bible today, particularly the New Testament is the best preserved of anything handed down to us in writing from antiquity. We can be more certain of what we read about Jesus' life and teachings than we can about Plato, Caesar, Aristotle or Homer!

So, yes the message in the bottle must be fascinating to many. But the message in the Bible is far more so, and the more we read, study and submit to it, the more we discover – but instead of looking back into the past only, the Bible was written in our past, to guide us through our present to prepare us for a never ending future!
